The bus where Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat

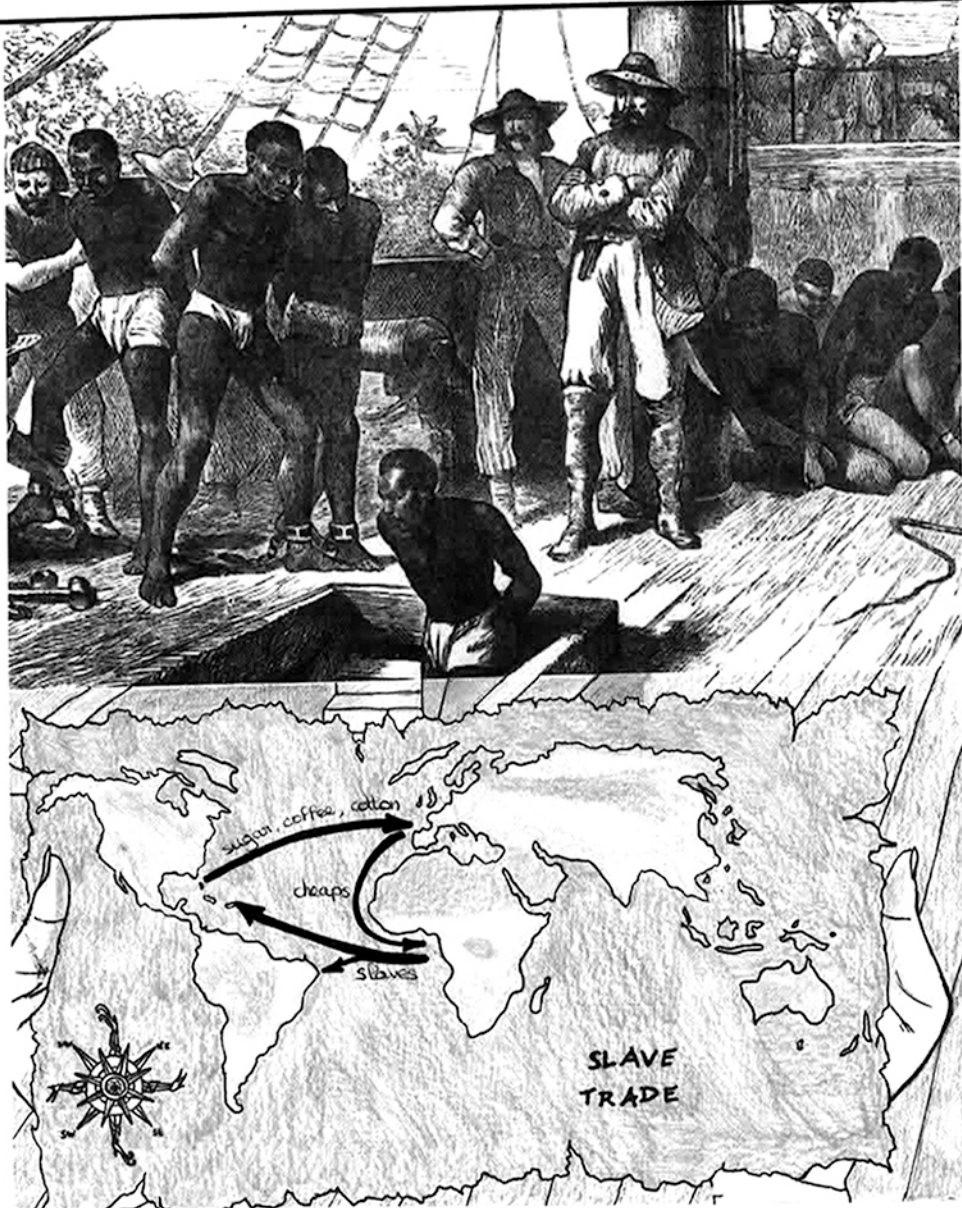

She was born on Feb. 4th 1913 in Tuskegee, Alabama



Rosa McCauley studied at Montgomery industrial school for African American girls and Alabama state teachers college for negroes.



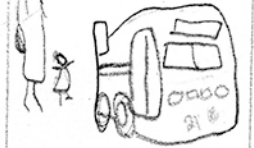
On December 1st 1955, she got famous because she refused to give her seat to a white passenger in the city bus in Montgomery.



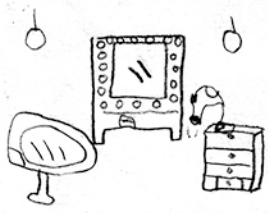
She was arrested by the police and sent to jail for one day and she was fined 15 dollars.



The black people after her arrest boycotted the bus system for 380 days to support her. They created movements for desegregation in transports.



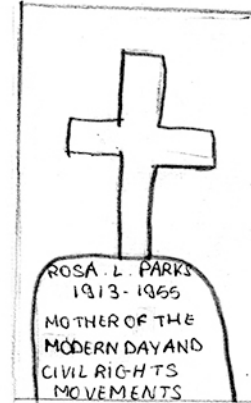
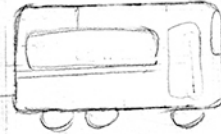
After her teens she met Raymond Parks her future husband, a hairdresser.



In December 1932 she married Raymond.



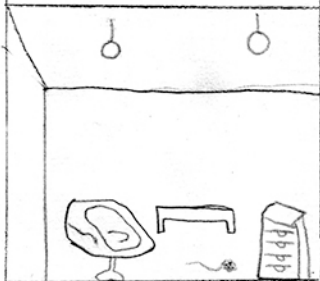
On November 13th 1956 segregation in public transport was declared unconstitutional by the Supreme Court victory.



Now, today she is an emblem of the movement and the abolition of segregation in the USA.



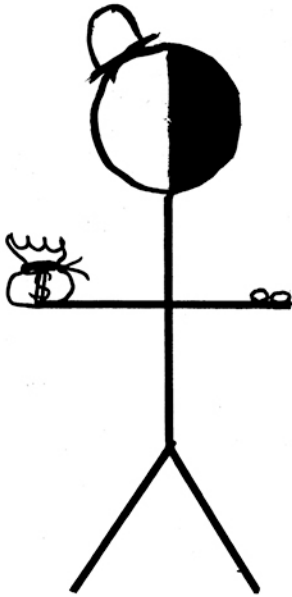
From 1930 to 1955 she worked as a dressmaker.



During this time she also joined the NAACP in 1942 as a secretary she became an activist.
